In addition to a traditional regulatory program, the division's responsibilities include establishing and implementing statewide waste reduction, recycling, recycling market development and litter prevention programs for non-hazardous wastes.

Regulations are under development to encourage the use of beneficial use byproducts to preserve resources, conserve energy and reduce the need for additional landfills. The division also oversees state and local planning for long-term solid waste management.

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Solid Waste Management Planning

The overriding responsibility of the Planning Unit is to work with the Solid Waste Management Advisory Council (SWAC) to create, update, and monitor implementation of the State Solid Waste Management Plan (State Plan). The State Plan establishes waste reduction and recycling goals to be achieved by the state and establishes strategies for the appropriate management of the state's solid waste stream. Implementation of the programs that allow Ohio to achieve the waste reduction goals is performed by a variety of state and local officials. Most of these officials work for or represent solid waste management districts (SWMDs). Thus, the Planning Unit spends a great deal of time providing technical assistance to and coordinating the activities of the solid waste management districts. The ultimate objective of Ohio's solid waste management planning unit is to ensure that the SWMDs provide for adequate disposal capacity for solid waste generated in the state and that residents, businesses, and industries in Ohio have access to and participate in recycling opportunities.

➔ **The State Plan represents Ohio's plan for reducing the state's reliance on landfills for the management of solid waste generated in the state.**

State Solid Waste Management Plan (State Plan)





The Division of Materials and Waste Management (DMWM) is in the process of creating a new version of the *District Solid Waste Management Plan Format* (Format). This new version, the *District Solid Waste Management Plan Format*, version 4.0 (Format 4.0) will incorporate the goals of the 2009 *State Solid Waste Management Plan* into local planning efforts. In addition, the Format 4.0 will make significant structural and technical changes to the current version of the Format. DMWM intends for these changes to improve how solid waste management plans are prepared and how information and data are presented.

DMWM is working with a subcommittee comprised of representatives from six solid waste management districts to complete the Format 4.0. DMWM will use this web page to

keep interested parties up-to-date about the Division's and Subcommittee's progress on completing the Format 4.0. DMWM will post draft portions of Format 4.0 and make them available for review as they are completed. Interested parties will be able to access these draft portions from the Format 4.0 tab below. DMWM will also use the web page to notify interested parties about upcoming meetings during which the Division will discuss the Format 4.0.


