Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(E)(7)(a) Authorization

Dear Ms. Shipp:

On December 7, 2001, Hull and Associates, Inc., submitted to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) a request, pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(E)(7)(a), to reinstate detection monitoring for ground water monitoring wells BW-7 (arsenic) and BW-8 (thallium) at the Noble Road Landfill (Facility). On February 19, 2002, Environmental Resources Management submitted a request, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E)(7)(a) to reinstate detection monitoring for ground water monitoring wells BW-7 (antimony) and BW-8 (COD). Monitoring wells BW-7 and BW-8 are currently in the ground water quality assessment program.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E)(7)(a), I hereby approve this demonstration and the owner/operator of Noble Road Landfill may reinstate ground water detection monitoring at the landfill for arsenic and antimony in BW-7, and thallium and COD in BW-8.

This approval is subject to the following conditions:

1. Because of the determination provided by the last two sampling events, the exceedances are considered to be outliers and shall not be included in the statistical background data set. Additionally, any subsequent statistical analyses shall utilize results with the lowest PQL.
2. Any subsequent statistical analyses shall not include any excessive PQL in the background data set.

Should future or existing ground water sampling results indicate statistically significant increases in ground water quality, the owner/operator will be required to enter into assessment monitoring in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E), or obtain approval to remain in detection monitoring pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c).

You are hereby notified that this action of the director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the ground upon which the appeal is based. The appeal shall be filed with the Commission within 30 days after notice of the action. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the director of environmental protection within three (3) days after the appeal is filed with the Commission.
