**RE: CUYAHOGA REGIONAL SANITARY LANDFILL, CUYAHOGA COUNTY
GAS EXTRACTION SYSTEM, ALTERATION APPROVAL**

Dear Mr. Herman:

On April 18, 2001, Waste Management, Inc., submitted an alteration request for the Cuyahoga Regional Sanitary Landfill. The landfill is located at 6640 Cochran Road in the City of Solon and the Village of Glenwillow, Cuyahoga County, Ohio. The purpose of the request is to specify the maintenance activities and procedures to ensure proper operation of the landfill gas collection and control system. An expansion to the existing system was approved in an Environmental Improvement Permit to Install (EIPTI No. 02-8490) on October 20, 1995. In addition, the alteration request included the following items: narrative description, plan sheet with well locations, well details of completed wells to be replaced, trench details and QA/QC documentation.

Based upon review of all the information, Ohio EPA hereby approves of the alteration to EIPTI No. 02-8490 with the following conditions:

CONDITIONS

1. Not later than 60 days after completion of all work proposed in the April 18, 2001, alteration request, Waste Management shall submit a Construction Documentation Report that includes the following: as-built site plan which includes surveyed well locations and surveyed lateral connections and a written description of the cap restoration including QA/QC documentation for well and pipeline installation.
2. This approval shall only allow Waste Management to conduct those activities as specified in the April 18, 2001, alteration request.
3. All waste materials removed during intrusive activities shall be containerized and securely stored until properly characterized and disposed in accordance with Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and regulations promulgated thereunder.

4. Any portions of the final cap disturbed by activities authorized by this approval shall have the cap system re-established in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-1, as effective June 1, 1994.
5. Waste Management shall take measures to minimize the possible increase in subsurface infiltration due to disturbance of the closed portions of the landfill.
6. Any on-site activities shall be accomplished in compliance with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations pertaining to environmental protection, including but not limited to the control of air pollution, leachate, surface water run-on, surface water run-off, and protection of ground water.
7. Any activities undertaken shall not create a nuisance, and shall not adversely affect public safety, human health, or the environment.
8. Nothing in this letter shall be construed to authorize any waiver from any requirements of applicable state solid waste laws or regulations. This letter shall not be interpreted to release Waste Management or others from responsibility under ORC Chapters 3704, 3714, 3734, or 6111; the Federal Clean Water Act, the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, or the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act; or from other applicable requirements for remedying conditions resulting from any release of contaminants from the facility to the environment.

END OF CONDITIONS

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Environmental Protection is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within 30 days after notice of the director's action. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the director within three days after the appeal is filed with the Commission.
