Purpose

CONSWLA is an acronym for Conservative Substance Wasteload Allocation Program. This modeling software was developed by staff from the Water Quality Modeling Section (now the Water Quality Modeling Unit within the Monitoring and Assessment Section). Prior to the development of this software, wasteload allocations for conservative substances were determined using a hand calculator, which was a tedious and error prone process.

Background

Staff routinely conduct wasteload allocations for conservative substances. These are substances that do not decay, so the instream concentration is a function of dilution. These allocations were initially all determined using a hand calculator. CONSWLA was developed by staff from the Water Quality Modeling Section to replace the hand procedure, although the basics of the hand procedure were duplicated by CONSWLA.

Procedure

The CONSWLA software is available on diskette and will run on a personal computer. In addition, a user's manual for the software is available as a hard copy only.
